To whom it may concern:

In our letter of April 1, 2020, attached for reference, we informed you that as a result of the unforeseeable and immediate dramatic downturn in business and occupancy directly caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, there would be a mass layoff at the **Homewood Suites by Hilton Orlando-International Drive/Convention Center** hotel located at 8745 International Drive, Orlando, Florida 32819 ("Hotel"). Further, we advised you that while we hoped the COVID-19 pandemic would end rapidly, that current health and economic conditions would change, and that we would be able to recall these employees as soon as possible, we didn't know how long the COVID-19 situation would last or its future effects upon the Hotel, and accordingly, we could not say if and when these employees would be recalled.

We have prepared this letter to update our April 1st letter to you, and to inform you that, unfortunately, we have determined that our business and occupancy levels are not projected to return to a sustainable level for the foreseeable future and the length and severity of the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic on our business will be greater than previously anticipated. As a result, we have had to reassess our initial understanding of the circumstances facing the Hotel. In our April 1st letter, we advised that approximately 40 employees were impacted by the workforce reduction at that time (the actual number was 41). Regrettably, it has now become apparent that these layoffs will extend beyond six (6) months for 24 of these employees. Furthermore, effective

June 19th, the Hotel had to proceed to terminate the employment of 10 of the remaining employees who were previously laid-off.

Attached hereto is the currently anticipated schedule of employment terminations since our April 1st letter, including a list of the job titles to be affected. No bumping rights exist for the employees, as no employees are represented by a union. We were unable to provide this notice to you earlier because the length and severity of the impact of the COVID-19 natural disaster and calamity, as well as the changing business circumstances resulting from the dramatic downturn in hotel guests and patrons, was unforeseeable and outside of our control.
